Introduction & Overview

- Al Martin (AM) welcomed all attendees and displayed presentation for discussion.
- AM made the following comments:

Note: all comments made are true and correct as at this point in time.

- Advised the minutes from the 7 October 2020 meeting are available online and outstanding questions have been addressed aside from providing clarity on the COVIDSafe Plans. CPVV is working with DHHS and DJPR and will communicate the updated information via the usual channels as soon as clarity has been provided.
- Provided an overview of rapid contact tracing and how it may apply to the CPV industry as Victoria progresses through the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Roadmap to Reopening.
- Discussed CPV Industry Risk Assessment which has determined the CPV Industry is at high risk for community transmission and the need for implementing controls to ensure community confidence is maintained.

Discussion – all attendees

- AM opened for discussion on supporting rapid contact tracing for the CPV industry noting;
 - Discussed clarity would need to be provided around the 15-minute timeframe.
 - Discussed that unbooked and booked services should be actioned appropriately.
 - Discussed if it would be electronic or manual.
 - Discussed it may be best for CPVV to look nationally and internationally.
 - Asked if this could be subsidised and how implementation will be supported.
 - Discussed compliance and how industry can encourage passengers to use rapid contact tracing.
 - Discussed how to identify who was in the vehicle, not who paid for the trip and if there is more than one person in the vehicle.

MINUTES

- Discussed the COVIDSafe App and its limitations.
- BSP provided solutions they have implemented for rank and hail and booked trips.
- Discussed timeframe for rapid contact tracing to be implemented.
